



Coronavirus has quickly gained a reputation for being particularly pervasive. It can survive on surfaces for several days. Moreover, people infected by the virus don't show symptoms until approximately two weeks after infections, making it difficult to track and contain. Effective immediately, Clean Care has implemented several protocols and procedures to help protect our customers from infectious diseases, including the Coronavirus. While many of these practices are not new, we are being extra diligent in the way we clean. Below is a list of some of the things Clean Care is doing to clean for the Coronavirus. This list is evolving as we continue to learn more about best practices and what works best for our customers.

1. We use CDC and EPA approved industrial-strength disinfectants with a broad spectrum kill claim. As disinfectants are increasingly difficult to obtain from suppliers, our purchasing manager has identified and obtained an ample supply that will be made available to all of our cleaners.
2. Our cleaners will pay extra attention to disinfect all "high-touch" surfaces every day. High touch surfaces include door knobs and plates, phones, bathroom fixtures and handles, light switches, elevator buttons, railings, countertops, and so forth.
3. We have increased the frequency of cleaning and disinfecting for many of our customers. For some, we have increased the number of times per week that we clean. For others, we have increased the amount of time we spend cleaning so that we disinfect more frequently throughout the day. We try to accommodate all requests as quickly and reasonably as possible.
4. Our employees have been reminded of techniques that they need to implement during this outbreak. For example, we have encouraged them to use gloves and other appropriate PPE at all times while they clean. We are recommending clean surfaces first with our general cleaners, then follow it with disinfecting surfaces with the appropriate disinfectant. Also, our cleaners have been instructed to wipe down nonobvious surface areas that may be missed, such as underneath counters, table, and chairs.
5. We have communicated with all of our employees on how to protect themselves from the coronavirus and other infectious diseases. We also have asked employees to contact us if they test positive or have symptoms. In these cases, the employees will not be permitted to return to work until after they are cleared by a health-care professional.
